

Undset Books Destroyed By the Nazis in Norway

STOCKHOLM, Sweden, Oct. 29
—The newspaper Dagens Nyheter said tonight in an Oslo dispatch that the books of Sigrid Undset, Norwegian author now in the United States, had been ordered destroyed by the Propaganda Ministry of Nazi-dominated Norway because they were considered not national.

Sigrid Undset won the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1928. The official Nazi press of Germany called for elimination of her works from the Reich's libraries in 1936, reportedly because she disagreed with Nazi racist theories.
