Boycott of Sigrid Undset Urged by Nazi Newspaper

By The Associated Press. BERLIN, Nov. 10.—The Westdeutscher Beobachter, Nazi newspaper, asserted today that the writings of Sigrid Undset, Danish novelist, should "disappear from the columns of German newspapers, from German libraries and from book stores."

The newspaper's ire apparently was aroused by the Nobel Prize winner's disagreement with Nazi racial theories.

"Mrs. Undset has betrayed the heartfelt hospitality she enjoyed in our cultural life," the newspaper added. "She did not deserve the veneration accorded her by wide circles of our people."
